1. ADDRESS BY THE VICE CHANCELLOR

The Vice Chancellor extended a warm welcome to all the members for the 26th meeting of the Academic Council.

He presented the following: -

- (a) As per the 7th Annual report on employability by Aspiring Minds, "Over 89% of engineers in India are unemployable for any job in the knowledge economy". As a result of this, a large number of vendors / education providers approaching us to offer value added courses / industrial training to our students to improve their competence through emails / letters and in person. If these companies are allowed space in our system, the role of faculty will be taken over by them. So the alternative is to train our faculty to be more resourceful and updated, to prevent such pseudo firms to enter into our space.
- (b) Professional Societies like American Society of Civil Engineers offer online education programmes of 6 weeks and 12 weeks for practicing engineers. Today, Dr. Siddalinga Swamy, Director AICTE is delivering a lecture to our faculty on SWAYAM in our campus. Over 30 lakh students are active in the SWAYAM portal. We should also get into the space of online course and

continuing education. The faculty members need to develop online courses for which a policy needs to be framed.

- (c) Accreditation for five courses has been conducted by the NBA from 22nd to 24th February 2019. The major observations of the NBA are given below: -
 - (i) Success rate is low.
 - (ii) Research projects are not up to the standard.
 - (iii) Need improvement in quality of publications
 - (iv) Teaching is at technician level only.

Preparation for the second phase NBA accreditation for another five programmes is under process.

- (d) The State of Haryana has adopted a systematic approach to transforming education outcomes and it has achieved the success rate from 40% to 80%. Our institute should also set a similar target to achieve. We have to improve our capability to reach that level and to make learning outcomes more effective.
- (e) He proposed that every course needs to undergo an assessment as per NBA parameter every year. This exercise has to be carried out meticulously with the help of external experts every year.
- (f) This time 15 companies who have offered salary above Rs. 5 lakhs per year visited our campus did not make any recruitment and we have to seriously look into it and find ways to overcome it.
- (g) HITS has been rated <u>overall Gold</u> in the QS I-GAUGE rating. The score card indicates that we have been rated <u>Diamond</u> in the following categories, namely employability, facilities and accreditation. <u>Gold</u> in teaching and learning, faculty quality, student diversity, social responsibility and entrepreneurship and <u>Silver</u> rating in research.

- (h) FSR need to be maintained at 1:15 for getting 2.5 more marks in the NIRF rankings.
- (i) We have set a target of two indexed journal papers per faculty per year.
 We need to get into the space of consultancy to a greater extent in the years ahead.
- (j) We have already started research at the UG level. Next year we would expect about 60 publications and already published 4 indexed papers.
- (k) As the strength of the institute is more than 7000, we have to carry out the activities at the department level rather than centrally for achieving success.
- (I) He proposed "one faculty one industry" scheme to further promote Institute – Industry Interaction and enhance close collaboration with industry. Industry – Institute interaction provides a platform for both students as well as faculty members. This will become part of the 'Performance Based Appraisal Systems' of the faculty members. The details of the scheme in appended as APPENDIX – A.
- (m) We have introduced Learning Management System and improved the curriculum to a greater extent. Project Based Learning has been given focus in the first year and this has to be continued vigorously.
- (n) He requested the Management to allocate more funds for conducting FDPs for knowledge updation and empowerment of the faculty.
- (o) We are starting a Law School and B.B.A. L.L.B (Hons) will be introduced from the academic year 2019-20 onwards. The proposed intake for the programme is 60. The infrastructure and other requirements are being created. There will be an inspection by the Bar Council of India before starting of the programme.
