#### 1. OPENING REMARKS BY THE CHANCELLOR

The Chancellor welcomed all the members and said that HITS has achieved many milestones in the year 2019. She expressed her expectation to achieve more in the year 2020 She reported that the 10th Convocation of HITS was held on 19 October 2019, Mr. V.K. Mathews, Executive Chairman, IBS Group, Trivandrum was the Chief Guest. Mr. Bala K Baradwaj, Managing Director, Boeing India Engineering & Technology Centre, Bengaluru & President SAEINDIA; Mr. Tony Thomas, Corporate Vice President & Chief Information Officer, Global IS/IT, Nissan Motor Co. Ltd., Japan; and Prof. Col. Dr. James Thomas, Principal Advisor, Prof. of Cardiac Surgery, Director Specialties & Former Vice Chancellor of Padmashree Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai as Guests of Honour. She informed that the chief guest and the guests of honour were awarded with Doctor of Science (Honoris Causa) on this well-organized event.

The Chancellor said that 28<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Academic Council is convened to seek approval for a few amendments in the Academic Regulations and also pass the resolutions brought forward by the Boards of Studies. She also reported that the IET Accreditation Advisory team visited HITS on 5th and 6th September 2019 and all the five programmes applied for the Advisory visit is recommended to apply for accreditation. The team has identified certain concerns and the same needs to

be rectified before the visit of IET expert team for Accreditation. She advised the respective departments to take appropriate measures. She said that the data for the NIRF Rankings 2019 has been successfully uploaded and a better ranking is expected this year.

#### 2. ADDRESS BY THE VICE CHANCELLOR

The Vice Chancellor welcomed all and informed that the HITS has a good mentoring system with three qualified full time counsellors. He said that 20 students are attached to each faculty member for mentoring and career guidance. He said that HITS is striving hard to equip the students with good skills and knowledge in order to contribute to the industry 4.0. He informed that the admission process has started and the entrance examination is scheduled during the last week of April 2020. He expressed his hope to have more admissions for the academic year 2020-21. He also informed about the commencement of School of Design and the proposal to introduce new courses from the academic year 2020-21.
