#### 1. OPENING REMARKS BY THE CHANCELLOR

The Chancellor welcomed the members and said that convening the 29<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Academic Council by online was necessitated due to the Covid 19 pandemic. She expressed her concern and congratulated all those who contributed working in the frontline, especially the Robotics and Drone teams which supported the Government in a timely manner in spite of the prevalent hurdles. The Chancellor congratulated on achieving the NIRF ranking for Engineering & Architecture. The meeting is being held to seek approval for a few amendments in the Academic Regulations, proposals for Assessments and Grading for 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> semester students and also pass the resolutions brought forward by the Boards of Studies. She informed that online classes for all students, online Project Viva Voce Examination and Online End Semester Examination for the final year students were conducted successfully. The final year students were also given an option to appear offline examination after reopening of the campus. The results will be published soon. The Online classes for next semester for the second and third year students will begin from middle of July.

#### The Vice Chancellor presented the following: -

- (a) HITS has secured the 107<sup>th</sup> rank in Engineering and 20<sup>th</sup> rank in Architecture in the recently announced National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) Rankings – 2020.
- (b) He has presented the Statistics of admissions during 2019-20 in Engineering & Technology, Management, Liberal Arts, Design, Law and Architecture Programs.
- (c) He informed about the approval obtained from AICTE for offering Open Distance Learning in Business Administration and Computer Applications. The delivery of lectures is proposed to be done through Online. The focus will be on industrial training, improving knowledge and skills, enhancing attitude of students etc. He also presented the approval received from AICTE on extension of approval for existing programmes, new programmes, changes in intake and dropped out programmes for 2020-21.
- (d) The HITS (LMS) MOODLE and MS TEAMS Platforms were used during the lockdown period for the conduct of online classes. Now, the institution is in the process of integrating the MOODLE and MS TEAM. It is proposed to continue to use the MOODLE as our LMS and MS TEAMS as the delivery platform for the odd semester classes which will be mostly in online mode.
- (e) University has successfully conducted internal assessment, Project Viva Examination and End Semester examination for the final year students through online mode during the lockdown period. External examiners from the eminent institutions were employed during the conduct of Project Viva Examination to improve the quality of the projects. Apart from that, university has carried out the online activities through MS TEAMS, i.e. Meetings,

Industrial Webinars, Workshops, Conferences, FDPs, etc. during the lockdown period.

- (j) 218 research papers were published during 2019-20. It is necessary to take steps for increasing the number of publications by the staff members.
- (k) The Vice Chancellor appreciated the Department of Mechatronics and Aeronautical Sciences for the development of "Sevili" and project "Drishyam 4.0". The Robot "Sevili" is utilised in the isolation wards of major hospitals in Tamil Nadu. The drone "Drishyam 4.0" supported the Police Department for crowd monitoring and control during the COVID-19 lockdown period. Dr. D. Dinakaran, Dr. M.M. Ramya & Team and Aero Department staff and students were congratulated for their excellent contributions.
- (I) The Department of Mechatronics has also developed an affordable protection tool for medical frontline from harmful viral and bacterial infections when they work inside the critical care units for long hours. This system is uniquely designed for public health professionals to be used along with PPE, to fight against COVID-19 pandemic.

the UG programs curriculum is not very clear which needs to be

changed appropriately. The UG (LA) programs shall consist of at least

one course on Communicative English or Business English.

(ii) HITS presented curriculum and syllabi for many UG general programs

in this Academic Council. She expressed her doubt whether it is the

right time to launch many new programs during this pandemic

situation. It is necessary to check the course code, quality of course

content, before start offering the programs.

(c) Dr. Dharanipragada Janakiram suggested to explore the possibility of

introducing 2 year on campus and 2 year off campus B.Tech. programs.

Also suggested that the online courses to be offered only if the support

infrastructure is good.

(d) Dr. Ilavazhagan, Director (International Affairs) informed that we should

employ the faculty of our partner universities to handle one or two courses

in a program which will add lot value to the department / university.

(i) Dr. G. Ilavazhagan and the team were facilitated for their active contribution
