Dr. Pon Ramalingam, Registrar welcomed the members and requested the Pro Chancellor to give opening remarks in the Academic Council Meeting.

## **1. Opening remarks by the Pro Chancellor:**

The Pro Chancellor welcomed the members and said that the Chief Guest and others who attended the 11th Convocation appreciated the Projects executed by the students. He requested our staff to continue to apply for funded research projects from the funding agencies. This year we need to focus more on industry oriented projects, he opined. He also stressed that unique features are to be embedded in each programme offered by the University to fulfill the needs of the industries. He suggested to the teachers to explore the possibility of nominating Supervisors from Industries / Research Organizations to guide Ph.D. Scholars. The Pro Chancellor also mentioned that such industry experts who visit the campus be requested to handle sessions in workshops or seminars to interact with our students to encourage them to excel in their skills and talents.

The Pro Chancellor said that a better NIRF ranking is expected by the Institution this time. He also conveyed that the Board of Research has been reconstituted with more National and International experts, emphasized that it is necessary to study the requirements of the society to reorient our research to innovate new products which will be beneficial to the local community. The students should be given training in developing their skills and talents to develop them more employable, he opined

## **2. Address by the Vice Chancellor:**

The Vice Chancellor welcomed all members and introduced new members. He stated that all our staff members have to work together for the progress and development of the Institution. We need to plan for introduction of new programs which will be unique in nature. He also pointed out that, this uniqueness of our programs will definitely attract attention of the industries, parents and prospective students. He insisted to have well framed regulations in line with the UGC regulations. Good documentation of the activities will help us to submit required data for NIRF Ranking to achieve good ranking for the University in NIRF, he insisted.

**4. Action taken report on the 30<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Academic Council held on 9<sup>th</sup> January 2021:**

Rev. Fr. Dr. Xavier Alphonse stressed the importance of maintaining records including the assessments with respect to online examinations conducted by the University. These records will help to provide details to any Accreditation Committee in case they ask for information about online examinations.

The Controller of Examinations explained the steps involved in the evaluation system. After detailed deliberations, Rev. Fr. Dr. Xavier Alphonse stated that we have well defined procedure for evaluation system.

Members suggested that in order to get higher grade in NAAC, the documentation in the COE Office, like preparation of question papers, evaluation process, credibility of conduct of examinations, rubrics, etc., must be available for scrutiny by Experts Committee. Online examination process / procedure should be vetted by the IQAC in order to further strengthen the system.
