1. Welcome by the Registrar:

Dr. Pon. Ramalingam, Registrar welcomed all the members of the Academic Council for the 35th meeting and introduced Dr. John Varghese, Principal, St. Stephens College, New Delhi, who is attending the meeting physically for the first time and Dr. J.M. Mathana, the new Dean (Research). He requested the Chancellor to give the opening remarks.

2. Opening remarks by the Chancellor:

The Chancellor after extending a warm welcome to all the members stated as follows:

- ➤ The University obtained NBA accreditation for the five programmes of B.Tech. viz., Aerospace, Information Technology, Electrical and Electronics Engineering, Electronics and Communication Engineering and Mechatronics.
- ➤ The Management has decided to apply for appeal for B.Tech. Mechatronics programme to get accreditation for six years under NBA.
- ➤ The NIRF ranking 2022 for the University is although improved, but it is not up to the expectation. The Faculty and administrators to work more to achieve better target.
- ➤ The Management congratulates all the staff members who worked for NBA accreditation and NIRF Ranking.
- ➤ The work for IET and NAAC accreditation are progressing and must be done with vigour.
- ➤ The Expert visit for the approval of 12-B status to the University is awaited.

- An Expert Team is visiting to the University for evaluation for NBA reaccreditation for the five programmes of B.Tech. viz. Aeronautical Engineering, Civil Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Computer Science and Engineering and Automobile Engineering on 20th August 2022.
- ➤ The admission of students in the programmes for the academic year 2022-23 is progressing well.
- ➤ The Convocation is scheduled to be held on 30th September 2022 (Friday). Dr. M. Ravichandran, Secretary, Ministry of Earth Sciences will be the Chief Guest and Dr. S. Somanath, Chairman, ISRO will be the Guest of Honour.

Thereupon the Chancellor requested the Vice Chancellor to give his remarks.

3. Address by the Vice Chancellor:

The Vice Chancellor, after welcoming all the members of House said as follows:

- ➤ The Curriculum and syllabi in line with NEP for all the programmes for the academic year 2022-23 is under preparation for placing the same before the forthcoming meeting of the Academic Council.
- ➤ The key factors in the NEP which will be incorporated in the Academic Regulations 2022-23 will be presented by the Dean (Engineering & Tech.) in this meeting.
- ➤ While the entry option is already in vogue, the exit option will be implemented later, but most of the other features in the NEP will be implemented through the Academic Regulations 2022-23 for all programmes.
