1. Welcome address by the Vice-Chancellor.

The Vice-Chancellor Col. (Hon) Dr. S. N. Sridhara welcomed Hon'ble Chancellor and Pro-Chancellor, Management members, External Members Dr. Rajeeva Ahuja, Director IIT Ropar and Dr. C. Emmanuel, Director, Gleneagles Global Health City, Chennai and other council members to the 30th Meeting of the Executive Council.

The Vice-Chancellor conveyed to the members that the Board of Management has been renamed as Executive Council as per the UGC Regulations 2023 and it was the first meeting after the change of nomenclature.

He informed the Mr. Nambi Narayanan, Former Aerospace Scientist and Dr. Veeramuthuvel Palanivel, Director of Chandrayan-3 mission, ISRO are to be honored with Doctor of Science (Honoris Causa) in the 15th Convocation scheduled on the same day.

The Vice-Chancellor briefed the agenda of the meeting.

2. Address by the Hon'ble Chancellor.

Hon'ble Chancellor extended a warm welcome to the members of the Executive Council (EC). He remembered the objectives of the great visionary and philanthropist Founder Dr. K. C. G. Verghese and Founder Chancellor Dr. (Mrs.) Elizabeth Verghese in establishing the Hindustan Group of Institutions.

The Chancellor informed that the Institution deems it a great honour to offer Doctor Honoris Causa (Honorary Doctorate) every year to renowned persons with National and International recognition. This year Mr. Nambi Narayanan, Former Aerospace Scientist and Dr. Veeramuthuvel Palanivel, Director of Chandrayan-3 mission, ISRO are to be honored with Doctor of Science (Honoris Causa) in the 15th Convocation ceremony. He welcomed the council members to grace the 15th Convocation function.

3. Confirmation of minutes of the 29th Meeting of the Board of Management held on 12-04-2024.

The Registrar presented the minutes of 29th Meeting of the Board of Management held on 12-04-2024 which was circulated to all the members.

The Registrar highlighted the following items approved by the members.

The Minutes was confirmed by the members with the following suggestions.

- The Pro-Chancellor remarked that the Fee structure 2024-25 has been revised with 5% increase for all the programmes and a nominal reduction for Ph.D programmes in order to promote research activities.
- Dr. Rajeev Ahuja enquired about the fee structure for the Ph. D programmes and also shared that the fee at IIT Ropar for Research Scholars per year as Rs.1,50,000/-.

4. Confirmation of Action Taken Report on the 29th Meeting of the Board of Management held on 12-04-2024.

The ATR was confirmed by the members with the following suggestions.

- Dr. Rajeev Ahuja asked about the Trainers for the Hindustan Professional Career Academy. The Vice-Chancellor, Pro Vice-Chancellor and Registrar explained that IAS officers, retired officers and senior faculty members are offering appropriate training to the civil services aspirants.
- Dr. Rajeev Ahuja suggested to include Training Courses on Drone technology. Dr. Aby Sam, the Executive Director added that the Drones can be applied for flood relief and surveillance activities. Dr. Annie Jacob, Director remarked that the DGCA certifications are essential to offer such programmes. Dr. R. Asokan, Dean Aero informed that already few Short-term courses have been offered with the DGCA certifications and more will be included in the near future.
- Dr. Rajeev Ahuja also encouraged to initiate more Innovation and Incubation centers in thrust areas to attract more Consultancy and research projects. More design patents can be filed and transformed into products / working models to serve the community.
